# STUDY OVERVIEW

### RESEARCH PURPOSE

Assist designers and specifiers in understanding the most popular styles and features throughout North America and provide an indicator of what's trending for the next three years.

### RESEARCH OBJECTIVES

#### The specific objectives of the project are:

- Identify categories and new products that have the most dramatic impact on today's kitchens and bathrooms.;
- Determine styles, features, and materials that professional designers and specifiers think will be most popular over the next three years.

### METHODOLOGY/ SAMPLE

583 completed online surveys with NKBA database and lists conducted October 12-31, 2018

Respondent qualifications:

- Identify as one of the following: Designer, Builder/Remodeler, Cabinet Shop, Dealer, Decorative Plumbing/Hardware, Distributor, Manufacturer/Supplier, Manufacturer Rep, Architect;
- Have designed, specified, or sold products for at least 1 kitchen or bathroom project in 2018.

# KEY FINDINGS





- The most interesting new products for bathrooms include offerings in showers or shower surrounds, vanities/cabinetry and technology solutions.
- Bathroom categories needing more innovation include hardware/accessories, sinks and vanities/cabinetry (more style, color, material and storage options).
- Transitional and contemporary will be the most popular bathroom styles in upcoming years.
- Traditional, industrial, coastal, mid-century and organic show potential in the next few years as well.
- Bathroom design styles are differentiated most by colors, finishes, shower/tub tile, sinks and lighting.



# BATHS

## BATH TYPES DESIGNED IN PAST YEAR

Most designers have worked on all types of bathrooms in the past year, from master baths to full/guest baths and half-bath/powder rooms.



## BATH SIZE AFTER REMODEL

Most bathroom remodels stay with in the same footprint with out increasing square footage.



### AVERAGE COST (INCLUDING MATERIALS & LABOR)

Homeowners are investing the most in their master or en suite bathrooms, with a budget nearly twice the amount as that allotted for main or guest baths.

### EMERGING BATHROOM TRENDS DETAILS BY STYLE



Transitional bathroom design combines elements from both traditional and contemporary styles. Against a backdrop of neutral colors, transitional bathrooms can marry traditional features such as wallpaper, recessed-panel vanity doors and marble countertops with more modern elements such as hex or arabesque-shaped tile and rose gold finishes.





Transitional bathrooms use natural light, and a timeless look that provides a relaxed feel.
